Var pension claim, S. 35855, it appears that William Cornwell or Cornell, alias Dectus Cornwell, served in 1779 two wonths as a guide when Stony Point was stormed and in 1780, served three months in Captain McKinstry's Company, Colonel John Malcomm's New York Regiment. He enlisted in Orange County, New York, Parch 17,1781, and served as a private in Captain Villiam Stevens' Company, Colonel John Lamb's Regiment of Continental Artillery, was at the Siege of Yorktown and served two years 9 most.

He was allowed pension on his application executed July 23, 1819, at which time he was living in Bullitt County, Eentucky, aged about fifty-eight years.

In 1820, he was living in Jefferson County, Kentucky, and stated that he had been a widower for mineteen years (name of his wife not given), and referred to two daughters

aged about twenty-three years and teenty-one years, their names are not given. The names of soldiers parents are not stated, and there are no further data as to his family.
