To the Hon. John L. Calhoun, Secretary at War

I applied Metcalf's circuit judge in and for
the fifth judicial district of Kentucky and sole
Judge of the Bullock circuit court, do hereby certify
that this day Abraham Field came before me and declared
under oath, that he was a citizen of the United States
and a resident of the County of Bullock aforesaid, that
he enlisted as a soldier of the revolutionary army, in
the fall of the year 1775, for one year, and served during
that time, in that capacity, in Capt. John Green's
company, in the first regiment of the Virginia line of
continental establishment; that in the fall of the year
1776, the term for which he enlisted having expired, he
left the army, but was not furnished with any reg-
ular discharge; that he is now fifty-five years old,
fable & uniform, & that from his reduced circumstances
he needs the assistance of his country for support.

Abraham Field also made oath before me that the
said Henry Field did serve as a soldier in the revolution-
ary army, in the company of Capt. John Green,
in the first Virginia regiment, during the term of
one year, from the first of the year 1775, to the fall
of the year 1776.

Mr. Kirk and Taylor also made oath before me
that the said Henry Field was a soldier and served
as such for about a year to the said Henry has

* In order to obtain the provision of the act of Congress of 1790, it is necessary
for a citizen of the United States to make affidavit in the several county courts,

above stated in his declaration, and that the said
Taylor was a Lieutenant in Capt. Green's company
while the said Henry served therein as a soldier

Henry Field a pensioner of the United States by Certificate
dated the 10th day of February 1819 at eight dollars per month
(and personally into the Court being a Court of Record and
delivered a Schedule of his Estates which the Court Valued at
Fifty six Dollars and to which the said Henry Field made
but agreeably to law). Whereupon it is ordered that the
said Schedule and Rate be recorded and Certified to witness.

"This the 28th day of May 1834 personally appeared in
open Court, being a Court of Record for the County of Russell in
said State by the Common Law and Statute Law of the State, Henry
Field aged seventy years residing in Russell County who being first
sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in
the Revolutionary War as follows. He entered in Captain John Green's
Company (in the fall 1775) in the first Regiment of the Virginia
line, in Continental Establishment, of Major Richard Taylor being
Major and Patrick Henry Colonel. He served in said Regiment until
the fall 1776. He then enlisted in the same Regiment for three years
the Regiment at that time was commanded by the aforesaid John
Green. After serving about three months he was taken from the
Rank by General Wayne who was stationed at Williamsburg
for the purpose of riding Marrying espouse. He served to the
end of the term for which he enlisted and was discharged at
Williamsburg. The number of his Pension is 6743 and the date
of his original application was on the 12th day of May 1818.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a Resident citizen of the
United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and left I have not
since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of
my property or my right theropn with intent thereby to be admitted
thence to bring myself within the jurisdiction of the Act of Congress
entitled an Act to provide for certain Persons engaged in the
land and naval service of the United States. Signed on the 18th
day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any one
in trust for me any property or security, Contract or debt due
to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in
the Schedule herunto annexed and by me subscribed witness
John Clegg, Notary Public, \$20. One thousand more valued at \$13. 12. 00
\$13. 12. 00. The small sum paid to Mr. J. R. King, Clerk, \$1. 50. 00

now has now brought off 1 Table fl. Glass and \$1.
\$1.50 making altogether the sum of \$6.50.

The declarant is by occupation a farmer. His wife
is about 50 years old is able to do but little. She has
been failing in strength & Constitution for some years past.
He has living with him one son aged fourteen years who
is partly and partly blind and not able to do much. He
has no other children four for eight daughters all
as healthy as men and women commonly are except the two
who live with him but he derives no support from them

Bullitt County Court,

On the twenty second day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine personally appeared before David L Brooks a Justice of the Peace for said County and State, Suey Field a widow of said County and State aged seventy four years on the nineteenth day of January 1839 who being duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the act of Congress passed July 7 1838 entitled "an act granting half pay and pension to certain widows". That she is the widow of Henry Field deceased who was a private in the Army of the Revolution (and who served in said Army as is detailed in his Declaration made in the Bullitt Circuit Court on the 28 day of May 1821 and his Pension Certificate for \$96 per year will more particularly show). Known on the Roll of Pensioners in Bullitt County the State of Kentucky at the time of his death - The original pension - said Certificate was delivered to the office for paying the pension when the last payment was made to his wife - said wife is his widow or to his widow, and she cannot now find - certificate or original to show its date or No. but she refers to the facts of record on file in the War Department to show - since Henry Field was in the Virginia Continental service) She further declares that she was married to the said Henry Field on the fourth day of March seventeen hundred and eighty nine; that her husband the aforesaid Henry Field died on the Twenty seventh day of May eighteen hundred and twenty three, that she was not married to him previous to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first of January seventeen hundred and thirty four, viz: at the time above stated - aforesaid State, that in consequence of bodily infirmity she is not able to appear before the Court to make this declaration.

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request information in regard to Henry Field of Virginia, a soldier of the War of the Revolution.

You are furnished herewith the history of the only Henry Field or Fields of Virginia, that is found in the Revolutionary War records of this office.

The data contained herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, W. GILL, based upon the Revolutionary War service of Henry Field.

He was born February 3, 1775, place not stated.

He enlisted in the state of Virginia (no definite place given), in the fall of 1775 and served as a private in Captain John Green's company, Colonel Pendleton's Virginia Regiment, length of service one year. He enlisted in the fall of 1776 and served as a private and express rider in Colonel John Green's Virginia Regiment, length of service three years.

He was allowed pension on his application presented May 12, 1819, at which time he was living in Bellarm County, Kentucky.

He died May 27, 1822.

The soldier, Henry Field, married ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~

Stafford County, Virginia, "his second wife", Sukey Waller Withers (the name of his first wife is not given). Sukey Waller Withers was born January 19, 1785 and was the daughter of James and Sukey Withers.

Henry Field's widow, Sukey, was allowed pension on her application executed February 23, 1839, then a resident of Bullitt County, Kentucky.
