On this fourth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five personally appeared in open Court, being a Court of Record for Bullitt County, John Goldsmith Resident in said County, aged Ninety eight years who being first duly sworn according to law on his Oath makes the following Declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the act of Congress of the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818 and the 1<sup>st</sup> of May 1820: That he the said John Goldsmith enlisted for the term of two years on the day of November 17<sup>th</sup> 1776 in the state of Virginia in the Company Commanded by Captain James Woodson in the 9<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment Commanded by Col<sup>o</sup> Statton in the time of the state of Virginia on Continental Establishment that he continued to serve in said Regt until the expiration of the time for which he enlisted when he was discharged from the ~~process~~ of Valley Forge in the state of Pennsylvania. That he hereby denies just his every claim whatever to a Pension except the present; that his name is not on the Roll of any State except Virginia. And that the following are the reasons for last making earlier application for a Pension than he obtained a discharge from an Officer whose name he does not recollect and having last said discharge by accident and having been informed that his Captain had long since departed this life he knew of no person nor does he yet know of any person by whom he could prove his service and he was advised that it would be necessary ~~to~~ prove his service by testimony before he could be placed on the Pension list, but he has hitherto been advised to apply on his own State of service. And in pursuance of an Act of the 1<sup>st</sup> of May 1820 also formerly known that he was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that he is

Not denied that I have by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisio[n] of an act of Congress intituled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the ~~and~~<sup>the</sup> Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not nor have any person in trust for me any property or security, contrary to duty due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscriber.

That since the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818 the following changes have been made in my property. Since that time I had an Equitable Claim to one hundred acre of land (of third rate). A man and wife about twenty dollars worth of Cattle and about thirty dollars worth of hogs. The Deponent further states that he is a Brick Layer by trade but is now too old and infirm to pursue it for a support. He has wife nearly of his own age who has been sick for upwards of four years and he has been forced to dispose of his land man & wife and a part of his cattle & hogs to pay his debts fully for the support of himself and wife. He has four children to wit their first two daughters who are grown and who have left him and he deriving no support from them. The Schedule of his property now owned by him is as following. I the Clerk of the County Court of Bullitt County in the State of Kentucky do hereby certify that it appears to the satisfaction of the Court that the said John Hollingsworth did serve in the Revolutionary War of States in the preceding Declaration against the Common enemy for the sum of One Month, under an engagement, on the Continental Establishment. Sales being, that the foregoing Act, and the schedule thereto annexed are truly copied from the Record of the said Court. And I do further certify, that it is the opinion of the said Court that the total amount in value, of the property exhibited in the aforesaid Schedule is Twenty dollars fifty cents. \$20. 50.
