Act 18th March, 1818. }

State of Kentucky

I do on this 29th day of March
1870 before me the subscriber Judge
of the 5th judicial district of Kentucky
the judge of the nation Circuit Court
personally appeared Eppa Hubbard
aged 60 years Resident in Said County
who is in my first class Town
according to law clothed on his oath
make the following Declaration
"That for the term of two years in the month
of February 1776 in the Company commanded
by Capt of s. Glaisher of the 8th Regt
Regt Commanded by Col. Muhlenberg
served as a Corp until about the 25th of
1777 when he Reenlisted for the Term
of three years in Capt Nicholas Moore
Compy. of the 4th Regt of Light Dragoons
Commanded by Col^d Stephen Moxton
that he served as a Corp in said
Regt until the month of Decr 1780
when he was regularly discharged
from service at Lancaster in

the State of Pennsylvania, that
he was in the Battle of Monmouth
that he was reduced to a ^{few} ~~few~~ lances
of his Country for support
that no other evidence now
is in his power of his services

Epp Hubbard a pensioner of the United States by Certificate dated the 1st day of March 1820
at the Rate of Eight dollars per month came personally into
the Court being a Court of Record and delivered a
Schedule of his Estate which the just value at \$85
and to which Hubbard made oath duly and truly to say. Whereupon
it is ordered that the said Schedule doth be recorded and
Certified to read "On this 6th day of November 1820 personally
appeared in open Court being a Court of Record for the County
of Breathitt in the State of Kentucky, a Resident of said County
aged forty three years who being first duly sworn according
to law, doth on his Oath make the following Declaration
in Order to obtain the Pension made by the Act of Congress
of the 18th March 1818 and the 1st May 1820. That he
the said Epp Hubbard was in the Revolutionary War as
follows. He in the early part of February 1776 enlisted
in Capt: George Gaunters Company in 8th Virginia
Regiment Commanded by Col: Peter Muhlenberg on
Continental Establishment, for two years. That he was on
the 29th of June in South Carolina in the Battle on Bulling-
ton - On the 11th September at the Battle of Brandywine
On the 4th of October at the Roads of Human Town and
on the 24th of December 1777. He was discharged at
Valley Forge. And on the same day re-enlisted in the 4th
Regiment of light Dragoons Commanded by Col: Stephen
Dwyer and continued in said Regiment till late in
December 1780 when the Regiment was sent into Winter
Quarters at Lancaster in Pennsylvania where he received
his final discharge. The Number of his Pension is 11560.

And in pursuance of the act of the 1st May 1820 I do
solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United
States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not,
since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed
of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to so
desert it as to bring myself within the provisity of an
Act of Congress entitell "an Act to provide for certain persons
engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United
States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day
of March 1818; And that I have not nor have any
person in trust for me any property or security
Contract or debt due to me nor have I any income
other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto
annexed and by me subscribed vizt
