The data which follow are obtained from the papers on file in Revolutionary War pension plaim, 3.36050, based upon the military service in that war of Joseph Lloyd.

The date and place edibirth and the names of the parents of Joseph Lloyd are not shown.

Joseph Lloyd enlisted in Virginia, about April 1, 1781, served as sergeout under Captains Samuel Finley, James Crain and Kirkpahrick and Oblanel Thomas Castins in the Virginia Troops; was at the siege of Tartious, where he was taken sick and sent home and was not able againsto rejoin his regiment.

In 1815, he moved to the state of Kentucky.

He was allowed pension on his application executed July 4. 1825, at which time he was aged sixty-four years and resided in Bullitt County, Kentucky.

On the above date, he stated that he was a school master and that his family then residing with him consisted of his wife, aged about fifty-five years, her name and date of their marriage not shown, and five children, three daughters and two soms as follows:Patty,Alsay and Lydia, aged respectively twenty-one, nineteen and twelve years; and John and George, aged respectively, seventeen and fifteen years.

Joseph Lloyd died May 11, 1848, place not shown.
